

## District Seeks Members for 2019 School Boundary Committee



As you know, the WSD is preparing to build a new high school and a new elementary school to meet the needs of our growing District. Part of that process will include adjusting school boundaries. Elementary, middle and high school boundaries will all be reviewed and are all subject to change as a part of this process. The WSD is accepting applications from parents and community members for the 2019 Boundary Committee which will tentatively meet five times between May and November. The Boundary Committee will work together with District administrators and a consultant to determine draft boundary scenarios which will be shared publicly to solicit feedback prior to a recommendation to the Board of Education. All schools will be represented on the Boundary Committee, and if you are chosen as a committee member and representative of a school, you must be willing to share updates and answer questions as to the committee's progress with parents and staff from your designated school. # WSD Schools Earn PLTW Distinguished Schools Recognition



Holt, Liberty and Timberland high schools, as well as South Middle School, have all been recognized as Project Lead The Way (PLTW) Distinguished Schools for providing broad access to transformative learning opportunities through PLTW programs. Holt, Liberty and Timberland are among just 64 high schools across the U.S. to receive this honor, and South Middle is one of only 148 middle schools in the country to receive the honor. The WSD has offered PLTW courses since 2007 and currently offers multiple courses in all three strands in high school (engineering, biomedical and computer science), as well as App Creator, Design and Modeling, Magic of Electrons, and Automation and Robotics at the middle school level, and a Medical Detectives course at the elementary level. Congratulations to four students from Stone Creek and Peine Ridge Elementary for their performance in the Amazing Shake <sup>™</sup> National Competition held at the Ron Clark Academy in Atlanta, Georgia. Fifth graders Alisyn Maupin and Kyla Humphrey from Stone Creek and sixth graders Bonnie Faye Cella and Catherine Hunn from Peine Ridge all traveled to Atlanta February 22-24 for the national competition after winning at the school and District levels. Kyla finished 119th, Bonnie finished 115th, Catherine finished 85th and Alisyn finished in the top 80 out of nearly 300 top competitors from across the U.S.

The Amazing Shake is a learning opportunity for young students that places an emphasis on teaching students manners, discipline, respect, and professional conduct. Holt High School senior Megan Wood has been awarded a scholarship through the Rotary Youth Exchange Program to study in Germany. Wood will spend an entire academic year in the country, with two to three host families, representing her school and country as she learns more about the German culture, traditions and language.

For Wood, this is the best way to prepare for her career. "Another reason I have taken the interest in going to Germany is because I aspire to be a German teacher and I know this opportunity would help me immensely with my career goals."

Holt High will have an exchange student through the same program next year, but the student and country of origin have not yet been confirmed. The Rotary Youth Exchange program began in the late 1920s, and now over 8,500 students participate every year from over 70 countries. 
### State of the District at Rotary

## Liberty Performing Arts Presents "Radium Girls"




