- In the planning review, and improvement of the Title I.A program, parents are involved by
  - Each year parents are invited to GTE to a review meeting where they are asked for their input.
  - GTE sends out parent evaluations asking questions inviting suggested ways to improve the education of their child(ren).



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- In addition, GTE asks for feedback during parent-teacher conferences, asking parents to fill out evaluations after every parent night.

  - Every year, GTE has a review meeting with parents to discuss future opportunities to improve family engagement.

- Timely information about the Title I.A program Section 116(C)(4)(A)
  - Every year, GTE hosts a Back to School meeting.
  - The GTE building administrator creates a Google slide to present information to parents at the Back to School meeting.
  - GTE has a pamphlet that is sent home with information, and also includes school information in their newsletter, both electronically and on paper.
  - o GTE also posts their Title information on their building website.
- A description and explanation of the curriculum in use at the school, the form of academic assessments used to measure growth and progress, and the achievement levels of the MAP are shared by:
  - Every year, GTE shares building information by the use of a Google presentation at their Back-to-School meeting.
  - In addition to classroom teachers sending home monthly newsletters providing additional information about the curriculum and assessments, this information is also shared during Parent/Teacher conferences.
