# Summer Additional Credits

- Students will complete 51 credits in 4 semesters of Dual Credit at the high school.
- 13 additional credits are required to complete the Associate of Arts Degree (summer).
- Credits can be taken on the SCC campus or online at the \$67.00 per credit hour rate.

# Cost of the Program

- Tuition cost of \$67 per credit + cost of books
  - Associates degree (64 hrs)
    - Includes summer courses
    - \$4288 + books
  - Core 42 plus (51 hrs)
    - No summer courses
    - \$3484 + books
