2025 KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION & SCREENING

Does your child start kindergarten next fall? If your answered, yes, you may register them for a Kindergarten screening by scanning the QR Code or selecting the button below!

All children who will turn five before August 1, 2025, are eligible to attend kindergarten. To register your child for kindergarten, follow the steps below:

- Complete a kindergarten screening. If your child has not been screened at their preschool, daycare, or at the Parents as Teachers office you may sign up for a screening here. Children who have not been screened yet will complete their screening at the registration event. Appointment required for screening.
- Attend registration event between 8:30 am-12:30 pm and 3:15-7:30 pm at Berrey-Place Center,
 One Campus Drive, Wentzville, MO 63385. Come prepared with the <u>required items</u> including
 proof of residency, immunization record, birth certificate, parent/guardian photo ID, and
 documentation regarding legal guardianship (if applicable). No appointment necessary.
- Check your address with our <u>boundary locator</u> to see which elementary school your child will attend.
- Create an account (or login) on <u>Focus School Software</u>, complete the online application process, and submit the required items within Focus School Software.
- Get excited and stay tuned for updates from your child's school as we gear up for the upcoming school year!

2025-2026 PRESCHOOL REGISTRATION

Pre-K Enrollment for the 2025-2026 school year begins in February:

- February 10-21: Currently enrolled and returning Pre-K families and WSD employees
- February 24: All Wentzville School District residents

To enroll in the WSD tuition-based preschool program, students must be 3 years old by July 31 of the year they are starting preschool.
