- Military equivalent of management staff
- Significant leadership responsibility at a young age
- College degree required (<u>available through NROTC Scholarship</u>)

- Enlisted Commissioning Program (ECP)


College Route

Scholarship Overview



Mission: To educate and train highly qualified young men and women for careers as commissioned officers in the United States Marine Corps.

Benefits

- Total value: \$180,000.00
 - Pays full tuition, mandatory fees, books, and, uniforms for qualifying universities
- Provides leadership opportunities
- \$250 \$400 per month stipend
- Structured academic environment

Eligibility Requirements

- U. S. Citizen / Naturalized Citizen
- 17-23 years of age
- AFQT: ≥ 74 or ACT: ≥ 22 or SAT: ≥ 1000
- Meet USMC Physical Fitness Standards (PFT ≥ 200)
- No criminal record or serious civilian offenses
- Be a high school graduate / on track to graduate
- Admittance to a participating NROTC College or university
- No excessive tattoos (waiver required)
- Only High School Seniors are eligible for the 4 Year NROTC Scholarship

* No ethnic background required to apply

How to Apply

- Start application online via NETFOCUS!
- Take the SAT or ACT and release your scores to Code 0656 or ASVAB/AFQT
- Apply to any of the eligible NROTC colleges or universities
- Complete Application Package
 - Board Photograph
 - NETFOCUS & NROTC Application Documents
 - Official Transcripts
 - Birth Certificate
 - SAT/ACT/AFQT Certified Test Scores
 - Counselor Evaluation
 - Teacher Evaluations (English and Math/Coach/Other)
 - Marine Officer Interviews*
 - Physical Fitness Test*
 - Physicians/Parental Consent Forms

Selection Boards



- NROTC Early Board Applications
 - Applications Due: October 2020
 - Board Convenes: 2 November 2020
- NROTC Regular Board Applications
 - Applications Due: January 2021
 - Board Convenes: 1 February 2021

Apply EARLY, potentially get boarded for

selection 2X



31 December 2020 = NETFOCUS Submission Deadline

- Good Class Standing
- Cumulative GPA
- Athletics and Extracurricular Activities
- Excellent Physical Fitness
- Student Government/Leadership
- Community Service/Employment
- Whole Marine concept


