School

Although the program of study is college preparatory, multiple level courses are designed to provide flexibility for individual differences and abilities for students in grades 9-12. North Point High School enables students to earn seven units of credit a year, using a modified block schedule. The Wentzville School District offers students opportunities with programs including A+, Advanced Placement (AP) courses, Alternative Program, Center for Advanced Professional Studies (CAPS), Dual Credit courses, Early College, Lewis and Clark Career Center, Missouri Options, and Project Lead the Way. Students will graduate with a general diploma and the option of receiving academic honors such as cum laude distinctions.

District

The Wentzville School District was the fastest growing district in the state of Missouri for two decades, adding on average more than 500 students each year over the last 20 years. The District currently serves over 17,530 students from a 90 square-mile area who attend grades kindergarten through 12. The District's commitment to quality education is evidenced by the fact that 87% of the District's instructional staff hold advanced degrees, and professional development is constantly emphasized among faculty and staff. The District continues to provide an excellent educational program and always looks toward the future, while ADA spending remains among the lowest in St. Charles County. North Point High School is one of four high schools that currently serve District families.

Community

The Wentzville School District is located in St. Charles County, one of the fastest growing counties in the nation and the fastest growing area in Missouri. The county boasts a good blend of commercial, industrial, and residential growth. It is home to corporate offices and industries such as General Motors (sole producer of GM's full-size van and mid-size truck) and the Mastercard Global Operations Center. The Wentzville School District is geographically located in the western part of the county, 40 miles west of downtown St. Louis and encompasses more than 80,000 residents living in all or parts of Wentzville, Lake St. Louis, Foristell, O'Fallon, and Dardenne Prairie, as well as surrounding rural areas.

Testing

The State of Missouri requires high school students to participate in the Missouri Assessment Program through the End of Course (EOC) exams. Prior to graduation, students must take EOC exams in English II, Algebra I, Biology and Government (if a student took the Algebra I EOC in middle school, they are required to take the Algebra II EOC before graduating). Juniors are recommended to take the ACT test. The PSAT/NMSQT is optional for sophomores and juniors. The ASVAB is optional for sophomores, juniors, and seniors.

ACT Results: The results posted are the MEAN scores for all testers in grades 9-12 in a given school year.

Missouri A+ Incentive Program

North Point High School is one of the elite public high schools in Missouri to be designated by the State Board of Education as an A+ designated high school. Missouri A+ Program graduates have the option to receive a state paid A+ Tuition Incentive Scholarship while attending any public community college or career/technical school in Missouri. A+ Program students must successfully meet the following state requirements to qualify for the A+ Scholarship: Attend an A+ designated high school for at least two years prior to graduation, graduate with an overall unweighted GPA of 2.5 or higher on a 4-point scale, maintain an attendance rate of at least 95% for grades 9-12, exhibit good school citizenship, achieve a qualifying math (EOC/ACT) score and complete 50 hours of district-supervised volunteer tutoring/job shadowing.

Graduation Requirements

In order to receive a diploma from North Point High School, students must earn 25 units of credit and pass examinations on both the U.S. and Missouri Constitutions. At least three credits must be earned from North Point High School and the student must have been in attendance the semester prior to his or her completion of graduation requirements.

North Point High School enables students to earn seven units of credit a year, using a modified block schedule. Courses in several levels of difficulty are available. Weighted courses include:

AP Biology, AP Calculus AB, AP Chemistry, AP Computer Science A, AP Environmental Science, AP European History, AP Language and Composition, AP Literature, AP Macroeconomics, AP Microeconomics, AP Music Theory, AP Physics, AP Pre-Calculus, AP Psychology, AP U.S. Government & Politics, AP U.S. History, Advanced Marketing, Anatomy & Physiology, Child Development II, Civil Engineering and Architecture, College Algebra, Computer Science Principles, Concert Choir, Cybersecurity, Human Body Systems, Medical Intervention, Pathways to Teaching, Pre-Calculus, Principles of Biomedical Science, and Principles of Engineering.
