

# 2021-2022 Mitigation & Prevention Strategies

#### **MASKING**

- Masks optional in buildings and outdoors; needs of specific buildings addressed if/when they arise
- Masks still required on buses (per federal requirement)\*

#### PHYSICAL DISTANCING

• Return to typical standards; encourage physical distancing when possible; increase physical distancing when possible during an increase in cases

### **HANDWASHING & RESPIRATORY ETIQUETTE**

- Handwashing and respiratory etiquette taught and reinforced with signage posted
- Hand sanitizer provided in every classroom and in communal areas
- Provide time for handwashing, as needed
- PPE provided in clinics
- Masks available to students, if needed
- Encourage proper respiratory etiquette and maintain heightened protocols for symptomatic individuals

#### **CLEANING & MAINTAINING HEALTHY FACILITIES**

- Nightly targeted cleaning of high-touch surfaces and all classrooms
- Routine targeted fogging (weekly in each building and nightly in health clinics)

## **CONTACT TRACING, ISOLATION, & QUARANTINE**

- Contact tracing in alignment with SCCDPH (mandatory through 6/30; expect LEA-led tracing to cease for the '21-'22 school year; LEA will assist SCCDPH with information, as needed)
- Isolation and quarantine in alignment with SCCDPH endemic guidelines

#### **DIAGNOSTIC & SCREENING TESTING**

- Testing provided at LPHA and within in district Mercy clinic
- Will continue to collaborate with SCCDPH to host pop-up testing in the event of an increase in cases

#### **VACCINATION EFFORTS**

- Previously hosted countywide vaccination event for educators
- District employees volunteered at SCCDPH vaccination events
- Will continue to collaborate with SCCDPH to bring awareness to vaccine events
- Will continue to publish vaccination opportunities to staff

#### **ACCOMMODATIONS FOR CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES**

• Create and follow accommodations, as needed, for students with Individualized Education Plans, 504 Plans, or Health Plans
